On consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge, order and decree that Henry T. Smith who is hereby appointed Commissioner for that purpose, do after giving twenty days notice of the time and place of sale, sell to the highest bidder at public auction the tract of land belonging to Isidore Parker and Harriet Parker known as the Carr place on a creek of two miles, having reserved power in case as well pay the tax of this decree, and for the balance, that he take two loads with goods, namely one for three fourths of the amount of sale and assign the same to Isidore Parker, and the other for one fourth, and retain the same as guardian of Harriet Parker, and that said Smith Commissioner make to the purchasers of said land a deed with special warranty, where said lands are paid, and report his proceedings to Court in order to a final decree.
