

On motion of David Russell guardian of Arthur R. Stephenson Ordered that the guardian be allowed to expend \$100. out of the principal of the waste estate release of the interest for the benefit of his said ward -

On motion of George R. Bate Ordered that Washington & Reddicks do execute state and settle account of said Bate guardianship of John Williams and make report thereof to Court.

On motion of Henry R. Hill guardian of Arthur R. Hill Ordered that the guardian be permitted to expend \$50. of the principal, and also of interest, of the waste estate for his board &c for the year 1827 & 1828.

12.22 John R. Williams having moved and attachment against the estate of Mildred Thompson for twelve dollars due for rent due 26th December 1828. And the Court the day made return that he had levied the said attachment on "one bid and furniture, one spinning wheel, one iron one stool and one pot and books". This day comes the plaintiff by his attorney and the said Mildred Thompson was brought called but came not. Wherefore it is considered by the Court that the plaintiff recover against the defendant the said sum of twelve dollars, when the same shall become payable and his costs by him in this behalf expended. And it is ordered that the officer who levied the said attachment sell the goods and chattels attached as aforesaid, or so much thereof as shall be necessary, according to law, and out of the moneys arising from such sale pay and satisfy this judgment to the plaintiff and the balance of any, restore to the defendant. And return an account of such sale to the Court.

On the motion of the Overseers of the Poor of Southampton County against Sampson & Riser for perverting law slave Parvato to go at large &c. The said motion is sustained till the next Court.

On the motion of Stephen Darrow Sheriff of this County William R. Parker is permitted to qualify as his deputy. It appearing to the Court that the said Parker is a man of honesty, sobriety and good demeanor. And therefore the said Parker took the several oaths prescribed by law.

For reasons appearing to the Court it is ordered that so much of the judgment of the last Court as directs the sheriff to exhibit on him thirty nine lashes immediately procuring his discharge; be and the same is hereby annulled.

The Registers of Potty Arbut, Tom Arbut, and Mary Turner past registers were examined and certified to be truly made.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till the first day of the next Term
