

On motion of Davis Bennett guardian of Martha H. Tiftman Ordered that the judgment be altered & reduced \$100 out of the principal of his wife's estate, value of the interest, for the benefit of his said wife.

On motion of George W. Peale Ordered that Washington Reddick do remain stale and settle account of said Peale's guardianship of Peter Williams and make report thereof to Court.

On motion of Henry H. Hill guardian of Martha E. Hill Ordered that the judgment be permitted to expand \$40. of the principal, value of interest, of the above estate for her board for the years 1847 & 1848.

Williams having obtained an attachment against the estate of Mildred Newfeld his bond for twelve dollars due for and due 25<sup>th</sup> December 1848 And the Court doth having regard thereto that he had levied the said attachment on "one bed and furniture, one spinning wheel, one cow, one sheep and one pig and hogs" That say come the plaintiff by his attorney and the said Mildred Newfeld was then called but came not. Wherefore it is considered by the Court that the plaintiff recover against the defendant the said sum of twelve dollars, when the same shall become payable and his costs by law on this behalf expended. And it is ordered that the officer who levied the said attachment sell the goods and chattels attached as aforesaid, or so much thereof as shall be necessary, according to law, and out of the money arising from such sale pay and satisfy this judgment to the plaintiff and the balance of any residue to the defendant. And return an account of such sale to the Court.

On the motion of the Overseers of the Poor of Southampton County against Sampson & Rice for permitting his slave Parker to go at large &c. The said motion is continued till the next Term.

On the motion of Stephen Gardner Sheriff of this County William P. Parker is permitted to qualify as his Deputy. It appearing to the Court that the said Parker is a man of honesty, probity and good character. And therefore the said Parker holds the several offices prescribed by law.

For reasons appearing to the Court it is ordered that no more of the judgment of the last Court at divide the sheriff to inflict on him than one month immediately preceding his discharge, to and that sum is hereby remanded.

The Registers of Betty Arbut, Tom Arbut, and Mary Turner first negroes were examined and certified to be truly made.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till the first day of the next Term.
