The Commissioners in this cause this day made a report which is in their words tenor. "By a decree of the County Court of Southampton dated December Court 1827 it was directed in conjunction with David Barrett Esq. acting under the direction of the Court, to sell the said land and negro of John Harry Barrett, which was done on the 21st January 1828 and reported to the Court accordingly. And I stated in my report that one of the said slave negroes had absconded; they were sold at the same time that the other slave negroes were sold and were bid off by Mr. Walter Myrick, four of them had since been retaken and removed by said Walter Myrick; they sold for the following sums to wit
