On the motion of Jesse Drury who produced the Sheriff's receipt for the tax imposed by law and entered into bond with security as the law directs a license is granted him to keep on working his house in the Town of Jerusalem till May Term next. It appearing to the Court that the said Drury is a man of good character and well addicted to domesticity or journey.

This day this cause was looked and came on to be heard by consent of parties and at the request of the Court upon the bill and answer filed and was argued by themselves On issue relation whereof the Court doth order, adjudge and decree that John Kitchen who is appointed a Commissioner for the purpose proceed to sell at public auction on the premises, to the highest bidder on a credit of twelve months (except for enough to pay the costs of Court and expenses of sale which he will demand in cash) the tract of land of which Martha Kitchen was seized, containing 66 acres and in the bill mentioned after giving ten days notice of time and place of sale by advertisements placed at two or more public places in the County where the premises - that he take heed with good security of the premises, in such sum as appears one third worth paid to John Kitchen, Rebecca Kitchen, Polly Hasty, Benjamin Kitchen, Susan Porter, Polly Hasty, and Elizabeth Kitchen each, and one third each to John C. Smith, and Elizabeth his wife, one third each equally divided between William Pigg, James Edwards and John Kitchen of Samuel Kitchen - one third each equally divided between Amy Elger, Polly, Martha, Ellen and John children of John Kitchen.
