The Comyns in this cause has made their report, which in these words to wit:
 "According to a decree of the County Court of Southampton bearing date November Term 1828, the undersigned Comyns, in obedience to the requisitions of the said court have proceeded to divide the tract of land of which Sally Brown died possessed, attended by Thomas D. Howell Surveyor, who found there to be in the whole tract three hundred acres, which we have divided between James M. Brown and Thomas J. Brown as follows to wit: Lot A. 1. containing the houses containing one hundred and thirty four acres, and valued at one half of the amount of the whole tract, we have allotted to James M. Brown as his share of the whole tract, which said Lot A. 1. is bounded by the lands of James M. Brown, Thomas Brown Jr. Lot B. 1. and by the river, and by a number beginning at a post on the boundary we said James M. Brown line, a course for lots A. 1. & 2. running thence S 77° E 290 poles to a small white oak standing on the river bank. Lot A. 2. containing one hundred and thirty four acres we have allotted to Thomas J. Brown as his share of said tract of land, which said Lot A. 2. is bounded by the river, described in lot A. 1. and by the lands of said James M. Brown and Lot B. 1. and by the river also here we return a plot of the said tract of land, the plot fully submitted to the Court James E. Polak, Thomas Brown and M. Brown Comyns for \$10.00."
