The Commissioners in this case did say made their report which is in these words to wit.

"A general account of the County Court of Southampton bearing date November Term 1823. We the undersigned Commissioners, in obedience to the requisitions of the said court have proceeded to divide the tract of land of which Sally Wren died intestate, attended by Thomas D. Wren surveyed, who found there to be in the whole tract three hundred acres, which we have divided between James M. Wren and James J. Wren as follows. Lot No. 1, including the house containing one hundred and thirty five acres, and ordered at one half of the amount of the whole tract, the same allotted to James M. Wren as his share of the whole tract, which he had lot A. 1. abounded by the lands of James M. Wren, Thomas Wren Jr. Lot B. 1. and by attorney river, and by a narrow lane beginning at a post in front of his house, and James M. Wren has a road for lots A. & B. running thence A. 77 & 290 poles to a small white oak standing on the river bank to Lot No. 2. containing One hundred and forty five acres were allotted to James J. Wren as his share of part tract of land which said Lot A. & B. 2. is bounded by the above described road, and by the lands of said James M.
