inquest for the body of this County and having received their charge withdrew and after forenoon recessed
and presented.

I, A. Penner and Charles Hollard for making an affray by fighting together in public at Southampton
before the County of Southampton within the last six months upon the evidence of William Kenner and
Henry O. Davis who were sent for by the grand jury and sworn in Court to give evidence -
Peter Goodman of the County of Southampton for selling goods in the said County without license
upon the evidence of Henry Hendrick who was sent for by the grand jury and sworn in Court
to give evidence.

The road leading from Davis' Ferry in the County of Southampton to the River Hamble
The road leading from Sayers' Ferry in the County of Southampton to the Diamond bridge.
And the said grand jury having nothing further to present were discharged.

Ordered that Sollom & Rose, J. A. Williams, George Johnson and Richard Parker or any
three of them, being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose to appraise
all the personal estate of Joseph C. Burford deceased and return the appraisement under their hands
to Court.

On the motion of William Davis Ordered that he pay out of the estate of Edwin T. Rose
to Robert Burford the sum of twenty five dollars for the benefit of the said Edwin T. Rose
orphans children.

Martia S. J. Clinton orphan of Martia Clinton deceased with the approbation of his Court
made choice of Martha Clinton for her guardian and thereupon the said Martha Clinton
with Charles Linton and Stevens Weiss for her securities induced into and acknowledged a
bond in the penalty of two thousand dollars conditioned according below -

executor named in the said Will who made with the said Jep Larkford and his wife
Carr Bowes and Jacob H. Dicks his securities induced into and acknowledged a bond in the
penalty of twenty thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs certificated and for
obtaining a probate of the said Will in due form.

any three of them being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose do
