Peace, returned by the appellant against the appellee on the 28 day of August 1848  
for \$100.00 and costs.

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Next day came the parties by their attorneys who bring fully heard, and the evidence adduced, and considered it is considered by the Court that there is no error in the said judgment. Therefore it is considered that the same be affirmed, and that the appellee recover against the appellant not exceeding \$100.00 his decy in the said appeal the amount thereof, together with ten per centum per annum damages thereon from the 28 day of August 1848 till pay made, and his costs by him about his defense in this behalf expended.

The Registers of Margaret Diggs, Henry Atch, Edmund Atch, Mary Anne Fells, Henry Atch, Paulina Brown, Henry Atch, Henry Atch, Peggy Turner, Edmund Diggs, Mary Atch, an Iron Tack, five negroes, were examined and certified to be truly made.

On the return of Howell Harris who made oath and together with William A. Jones and John A. Jones his securities entered into and acknowledged abroad in the penalty of one thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Thomas Fells dec'd. on due form.

Ordered that William A. Jones, J. M. Clarend and John A. Jones being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose do appraise all the personal estate of Thomas Fells deceased and return the appraisement under their hands to Court.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till the first day of the next Term.
