

Arthur A. Dewey, Samuel B. Wells, Benjamin L. Snow, W. S. Wood & J. H. C. Briggs are appointed assessors to superintend the election at Danvers.
 Allen Edwards, Alfred T. Stephenson, Stephen's Town, Burr Powers and William C. Stephenson are appointed assessors to superintend the election at Stephentown.
 Howell Harris, William A. Jones, James E. Jones, James Dewey and James Harris are appointed assessors to superintend the election at Danversville, and
 Mark T. Felt, Henry Goodrich, Edward Parker, C. D. Dickinson and Joseph T. Sales are appointed assessors to superintend the election at the large town - for the election of a delegate from the County to the next general assembly of Vermont, and a Representative from the Congressional District to the next Congress of the United States. And it is ordered that the said Assessors do see that the said elections are conducted fairly and impartially and according to law.

On the motion of James H. Jenkins, It is decided that one of the Commissioners of this Court do draw and seal a deed and account of said Jenkins' guardianship of Elizabeth Wellers and make report thereof to Court.

An account of William H. Jenkins' guardianship of Thomas R. and Virginia A. R. R. was returned and is decided to be on hand for execution.

The last Will and Testament of Nathaniel Farnis do^r was proved by the oath of Joseph Ingers, John Edwards and Robert J. Hawley the subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of C. D. Dickinson and Thomas H. Newton the executors therein named who made oath and together with Rev. G. Rife, Nathan A. Thomas, L. W. Mason, Alon. Myrick and Hanson R. Rife their depositories returned into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of twenty thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs and provided is granted them for obtaining a probate of the said Will in law Court.

This cause this day came on to be again heard on the bill, answer and decree formerly made in this cause, and was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof the Court doth certify, order and decree that Howell Harris, L. W. Mason & William A. Jones do divide the slaves on the bill mentioned, being the slaves belonging to the estate of James Myrick deceased, into four equal portions, to wit to allot one to James W. Rivers as administrator of his wife Pauline, one to Elizabeth Myrick and the remaining half allot to Howell Harris as guardian for Debit, and Farnis Myrick, but if a division in kind cannot be effected of said slaves, it shall be the duty of the Commissioners to sell as many as may be necessary to effect such purpose. And how they shall have voted in the premises make report in order to a final decree.

The Court doth assign Samuel Beall guardian to George Perry, James Farnis and William Carter nephews of Holladay Russell deceased and therefore to be gathered with William H. Jones his depository returned into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of ten thousand dollars conditioned according to law.

An account of C. D. Beall's guardianship of Benjamin J. Beall was this day returned and ordered to be recorded.
