And it is ordered that the said Commissioners do see that the said elections are conducted fairly and impartially and according to law.

On the motion of James H. Jenkins. Ordered that one of the Commissioners of this Court be directed to draw up a bill and account of said Jenkins' guardianship of Elizabeth Waller and make report thereof to him.

An account of William W. Nichols' guardianship of Francis R. and Benjamin A. D. Pope was returned and ordered to lie on bond for exceptions.

The last Will and Testament of Nathaniel Evans, deceased was proved by the oaths of Joseph Sykes, John Edmunds and Lester J. Shuford the subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of G. D. Brinkman and Thomas M. Newell the said two trustees named who acted with and together with Rev. G. Pope, Arthur N. Thomas, L. W. Mair, Alex. Myrick and Hammie P. Pope their securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of twenty thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs certificated is granted them for obtaining a probate of the said Will in due form.

This cause this day came on to be argued before me the full, upper and lower family Court in this cause, and was argued by counsel. Pope do divide the slaves in the will mentioned, being the slaves belonging to the estate of James Myrick deceased, into four equal portions so as to allot one to James W. Rivers as administrator of his wife Pauline, one to Elizabeth Myrick and the remaining half allotted to Howell Harris as guardian for David J. and Simon Myrick. But if a division in kind cannot be effected of such slaves, it shall be the duty of the Commissioners to sell as many as may be necessary to effect such purpose. And bear they shall have voted in the premises make report in order to a final decree.

The Court doth adjudge Samuel Riddle guardian to George, Perry, James Fanning and William Caudle orphans of Holliday Riddle deceased and therefore to be given unto William H. Bond his attorney in fact sole and uncontested title a bond in the penalty of ten dollars in damages according to law.

An account of E. J. Brinkman's guardianship of Benjamin J. Riddle was this day examined and ordered to lie on bond for record.
