

On motion of G. A. W. Newson, F. J. Mahon, John Wick, William R. Stephenson & James J. Williams who severally produced the Sheriff's receipt for the tax imposed by law and who severally entered into bond with security conditioned as the Law directs a license is granted them to keep an ordinary, that is to say the said Newson at his house in Jerusalem, the said Mahon at his house in Jerusalem, the said Wick at Wicksville, the said Stephenson at his house and the said Williams at his house in this County it appearing to the Court that they are men of good character and not addicted to drunkenness or gaming -

Ordered that the Sheriff summon all the acting Justices of this County to the first day of the next term to lay the County levy, and also to consider of the propriety of granting certificates to the Merchants of this to retail spirituous liquors.

On the motion of Asalet Pond who produced the Sheriff's receipt for the tax imposed by law a license is granted him to keep private entertainment at his house in this County till May term next -

Ordered that Howard Harris, William A. Jones, Joseph W. Cland and William B. Westbrook or any three of them do let to the Court undertake the repairs or rebuilding as to them may seem best, of the bridge across Williamsons ~~Pond~~ Mill pond, receive the same when completed and make report to the Court -

Ordered that James D. Bryant, Henry B. Laughlin, James W. Parker and Jonathan Darden, any three of whom may act, be appointed Commissioners to let to the Court undertake the embanking or draining the drain running down from the second bridge from the river so as to protect the embankment between the first and second bridge from washing or undermining or otherwise being injured from the freshets -

Joseph W. Cland is appointed Surveyor of the road from Druryville to Solomons place in the road of Thomas Turner de^d and it is ordered that the usual hands do work thereon -

On the motion of the Overseers of the Poor against Sampson Le Reso. This day came the parties by their attorneys who being fully heard and the evidence adduced considered, it is considered by the Court that this motion be dismissed -
