The Commissioners in this cause this day made this report which is in these words to wit—
Branch & Branch. Report of Commissioners— In pursuance of the decree and intended decree the
Commissioners presented on the 9th day of December 1847 to sell the land in the premises and he has
been disposed of the proceeds as directed. The Commissioner however it would be to the interest of those
entitled to the proceeds of sale sold the land on a credit of twelve months instead of six months as
was directed by the decree. The purchaser preferring to pay the credit instead of waiting ten weeks
payable twelve months after date, the Commissioner recovers it taking off the discount and paid it over
to the parties to whom the lands were directed to be paid with the receipt of the amount paid Mellen
D. Brown which has since been paid him as directed by the intended decree. Williams White became
the purchaser of the land on a credit of twelve months at the sum
