Harris the Subscribers witnesses thereto and Ordered to be recorded, and on the Motion of John W. Harris the Executor therein named who offered Oath and entered into and acknowledged a Bond in the penalty of One Thousand and Dollars, conditioned according to law, but without Security, (the Will directing no Security to be taken and the Court requiring none,) when Bond is ordered to be recorded (Certificate is granted the said John W. Harris for obtaining a probate of the said Will in due form -

✓ James Wells Sheriff and as such Committee of Erastus S. Williams, a Lunatic, having this day filed his petition together with a Copy of his Report, asking the Court to dispose of the funds in his hands which have arisen from the sale of the real & personal Estate of the said Lunatic, the Court wishing deciding any of the questions which are involved in this Case, doth adjudge, Order and direct that the Committee of this Court take a further account of the debts due and owing by the said Erastus S. Williams and Report the same to this Court, together with any Special Matter deemed pertinent by himself or which may be required by any of the parties interested to be so stated -

✓ Millard H. Harris, Officer of Horace Harris decd - now the age of fourteen years, this day with the approbation of the Court, made Choice of Joseph B. Prineas for his Guardian -

For reasons appearing to the Court, It is Ordered that the account of Geo. W. Dick's administration on Sarah Ramsey's Estate be committed to one of the Commissioners of this Court, who is directed to re-examine, rectify and settle the same & report to the Court with any Matter specially stated, deemed pertinent by himself, or which any party interested may require to be so stated -

Ordered that D. L. Tuley late Sheriff of this County, out of any Contingent Monies in his hands not otherwise appropriated, pay to J. H. Remington, Attorney for the Commonwealth of this Court, Three hundred and Twenty six dollars for his further services from June Court 1869 to May Court 1870 -
