Geo. W. Pickens, who stands indicted of house breaking, was set to the bar in custody of the jailer of this Court, thereof arraigned and pleaded not guilty to the indictment. And a panel of twenty four freeholders summoned by the Sheriff, were examined by the Court, found free from all legal exceptions and qualified to serve as jurors according to law. Thereupon the accused waived from the panel eight of said jurors and from the remaining sixteen the following twelve jurors were selected, by lot to whom there was no objection, to wit: Caleb Everett, James H. Henry, Moses Jones, A. W. Stephenson, Geo. Williams, Geo. W. Jones, Jas. H. Barnes, Jacobariah Taylor, Lewis W. Stephenson, Wm. H. Stephenson, W. E. Leigh & Cassius E. Bond, who were sworn the truth of and upon the promises to speak, and after hearing the evidence and arguments of Counsel, returned to their room to consult on a verdict, and after some time returned into Court having found the following verdict to wit: "We the jury find the prisoner Guilty, and for his punishment at one year in the Penitentiary" and thereupon the prisoner is remanded to jail.

John Scott who stands indicted of larceny this day appeared in Court in discharge of his recognizance entered into before this Court at the last February Term and was set to the bar in custody of the Sheriff of this Court and being thereof arraigned pleaded not guilty to the indictment. And a panel of twenty four freeholders summoned by the Sheriff, were examined by the Court found free from all legal exceptions and qualified to serve as jurors according to law. Thereupon the accused waived from the panel eight of said jurors and from the remaining sixteen the following twelve jurors were selected by lot to whom there was no objection to wit: Salathiel Gibbs, Jos. J. Harris, Joseph L. Council, James Gould, Allen E. Clayton, Wm. Johnson, James T. Borden, John Turner, John W. Whitfield, Pettway Johnson, John Edles, & Josephus Turner who were sworn the truth of and upon the promises to speak and after hearing the evidence and argument of Counsel, retired to their room to consult on a verdict, and after sometime returned into Court having found the following verdict: "We the jury find the prisoner guilty and have adjudged his confinement 30 days in the County jail." And thereupon the prisoner is remanded to jail.

Alfred Spratley who stands bound by his recognizance entered into before this Court on the 21st day of February 1870 with Patrick Spratley, Charles Spratley & Frederick Spratley his security to appear before this Court on the first day of March Term having failed to appear to answer the Commonwealth of and concerning a certain felony whereof he stood charged having failed to appear. On the motion of the Attorney for the Commonwealth it is ordered that a writ of Seire facias be issued against the said Alfred Spratley and his said Securities returnable here on the first day of the next quarterly Term of this Court to show cause if any they can why the Commonwealth of Virginia execution against them
