John Scott who stands convicted of Larceny was again led to the bar in custody of the jailer of this Court and on his motion <sup>and for reasons appearing to the Court</sup> the verdict rendered against him on yesterday is set aside and a new trial awarded. Whereupon the attorney prosecuting for the Commonwealth with the consent of the Court saith he will not further prosecute against the said John Scott upon the indictment aforesaid. Therefore it is ordered that he be discharged from custody. →

The attorney prosecuting for the Commonwealth with the consent of the Court saith he will not prosecute further on the indictment against Joseph Weaver for Burglary. Therefore it is ordered that he be discharged from his imprisonment.

Wade Peat who stands bound by recognizance entered into before this Court on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of October 1869 with Harrison Crocker, Wm. Peterson, Wm. Mason, Abram Langston, Solomon Stephens, Tom Sykes, Joseph Scott, Tho. Claud, Daniel Ricks, Thomas Birdsong & Wm. Turner his securities to be and appear before this Court on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of November Term 1869 to answer the Commonwealth of a certain larceny whereof he stood accused having failed to appear. It is ordered that a writ of Habeas corpus be issued against the said Wade Peat and his securities returnable here to the first day of August Term next.
