The Same Judge as yesterday.

Geo. H. Preble who stands convicted of house breaking was again
brought to the bar in yesterday of the failure of this Court, and it being
demanded of him if anything for himself he had or knew to say
why the Court should not now proceed to pronounce judgment against
him according to law, and nothing being offered or alleged in
delay of judgment. It is considered by the Court that the said
Geo. H. Preble, be imprisoned in the Penitentiary of this Commonwealth
for the term of two years, (the period by the Jurors in their
verdict ascertained,) to hard labor. And the Sheriff of this County
is ordered as soon as possible after the adjournment of this Court,
to remove and convey the said Geo. H. Preble from the jail of this
County to the Penitentiary of this Commonwealth to be kept
imprisoned and treated in the manner directed by
law, for the term aforesaid.

On the petition of Benj. E. Worrall Administrator of Est. of B. L. Barnes,
for instructions from this Court as to whether he shall accept
the offer made to him of twenty five cents to the dollar
on a debt due to the said Barnes by Bond from J. W.
Kinard & B. B. Kinard, which said Petition, with the
said Bond is ~~also~~ day filed in Court. The Court on Consider-
ation thereof, and no evidence adduced and arguments of Counsel
being of opinion that under all the circumstances the said
offer is reasonable, just and equitable satisfaction of the
said debt, do hereby adjudge, order and decree, that twenty five
dollars & five cents (\$25.05) be received by the said
Administration in full discharge of the said debt.

Samuel Briggs a resident of the State of Alabama,
having been committed to the jail of this County as a lunatic.
It is ordered that the Sheriff of this County as soon
as practicable return or cause to be returned the
said Samuel Briggs to his friends or to the proper
authorities of the State of Alabama.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till
the first day of the next Term.
