

A Certificate of the qualifications of John B. Baker as Justice of the Peace, in the Township of Deer Township for the term of two years, of Isaac E. Howe as Justice of the Peace in said Township for the term of three years, and of Geo. W. Stephenson as Commissioner of Deeds in said Township, for the term of two years, commencing on the 1st day of July 1870, before the Judge of this Court in vacation, were returned and ordered to be filed.

A Certificate of the appointment of Norflet B. Ridley as Justice of the Peace in the Township of Baykins Sept was this day returned and ordered to be entered of record, and is in these words to wit: "Saskatchewan County, to wit: I Joseph W. Wagnon Judge of the County Court of said County, do on this 1st day of August 1870, in vacation of the said Court, appoint Norflet B. Ridley a Justice of the Peace in the Township of Baykins Sept for the term of three years commencing on the 1st day of July 1870, to fill the vacancy caused by the failure of W. H. Fuller to qualify, and thereupon the said Norflet B. Ridley appeared before me and qualified by taking and subscribing the Oaths required by law Given under my hand this 1st day of August 1870."
