

The vacancy caused by the said John J. Tyler's failure to qualify and thereupon he took and subscribed the oaths required by law.

The Court appoints Robert Ridley a Justice of the Peace in the Township of Drewrysville in this County for the term of three years commencing on the 1st day of July last to fill the vacancy caused by the failure of J. R. Corbin to qualify, and thereupon the said Robert Ridley took and subscribed the oaths required by law.

The Court appoints Geo. T. Camp Commissioner of Roads in the Township of Drewrysville in this County for the term of one year commencing on the 1st day of July 1870 to fill the vacancy caused by the failure of E. A. Drewry to qualify and thereupon the said Geo. T. Camp took and subscribed the oaths required by law.

Samuel Kello late Sheriff of this County with the consent of the Court doth appoint R. P. Pope his deputy and thereupon the said R. P. Pope took and subscribed the oaths required by law. It appearing to the Court that the said R. P. Pope is a man of honesty and good demeanor.

The Court appoints Robert Rowland Supervisor in the Township of Drewrysville in this County for the term of one year commencing on the 1st day of July 1870 to fill the vacancy caused by the failure of the said Robert Rowland to qualify and thereupon the said Robert Rowland with James E. Peters his security (who justified on oath as to his sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of five hundred dollars conditioned according to law, which bond is ordered to be recorded, the said Rowland also took and subscribed the oaths required by law.

The Court appoints James H. Devany Supervisor in the Township of Jerusalem in this County for the term of one year commencing on the 1st day of July 1870 to fill the vacancy caused by the failure of the said James H. Devany to qualify and thereupon he together with Wm. W. Cobb his security, who justified on oath as to his sufficiency, entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of five hundred dollars conditioned according to law, which bond is ordered to be recorded. The said James H. Devany also took and subscribed the oaths required by law.

The Court appoints John C. Griffin Supervisor in the Township of Berlin in this County for the term of one year commencing on the 1st day of July 1870 to fill the vacancy caused by the failure of the said John C. Griffin to qualify, and thereupon the said Griffin with James B. Jones his security (who justified on oath as to his sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of five hundred dollars conditioned according to law, which bond is ordered to be recorded. The said John C. Griffin also took and subscribed the oaths required by law.
