

The Judge of this Court this day issued a warrant from the bench directed to the Sheriff or any Constable of this County Commanding him to apprehend Geo. Furd, and carry him before a Justice of this County to be dealt with according to law, concerning the Offense for which he was presented by the grand jury in yesterday.

The Court doth appoint Joseph L. Barkham aforesaid to appraise the value of all Lands and Lots together with the improvements thereon in District No 2 of the Municipality of the Avenue in this County pursuant to an act of the General Assembly of Virginia approved July 7th 1870, and thereupon the said Joseph L. Barkham together with Ben E. Pope, his Security, (who justified in Cash as to his Sufficiency,) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Five Thousand dollars, Conditioned according to law, which bond is ordered to be recorded, thereupon the said Joseph L. Barkham took the Oath required by law.

The Court appoints Joseph L. Barkham aforesaid in the Township of Peyton's Dept in this County for the term of one year commencing on the 1st day of July 1870, to fill the vacancy caused by the failure of Charles Barnes to qualify and thereupon he together with Ben E. Pope his Security, (who justified in Cash as to his Sufficiency,) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Two Thousand dollars Conditioned according to law, which bond is ordered to be recorded, The said Joseph L. Barkham, also took and subscribed the Oath required by law.

Ordered that W. W. Briggs Sheriff of this County take the Estate of Nancy Newton dec into his hands and administer the same according to law.

Ordered that the following accounts to wit; be in favor of W. W. Briggs Sheriff for \$13.50 and the balance in favor of Joseph B. Prince Attorney for the Commonwealth for \$20.00 be certified to the Auditor of Public Accounts for his Examination and payment.

On the Application of Mary Barrett for leave to keep an Ordinary at the residence of Mrs. Josephine Howard, formerly St. Sebaste and E. F. Gardner at Jerusalem, the Court doth certify that the said applicants are persons of Sobriety and good character and that the places where the same to be kept are fit and convenient.
