

Ordered that Elij Hill be summoned to appear here on the first day of the next quarterly Term to show cause, if any he can, why an Information should not be filed upon the presentment made against him on yesterday, by the grand jury.

William Parham who stands convicted of house breaking was led to the bar in custody of the jailor of this Court and it being demanded of him if any thing for himself he had or knew to say why the Court should now proceed to pronounce judgment against him according to law, and nothing being offered or alleged in delay of judgment it is considered by the Court that the said William Parham be imprisoned in the penitentiary of this Commonwealth for the term of twelve months, the period by the jurors in their verdict ascertained. And the Sheriff of this County is ordered as soon as possible after the adjournment of this Court, to remove and convey the said William Parham from the jail of this Court to the said Penitentiary, there to be kept, imprisoned and treated in the manner directed by law for the term aforesaid. And the prisoner is remanded to jail.

Ordered that Joseph B. Price, attorney for the Commonwealth write to the President of the Norfolk and Great Western Rail Road, urging compliance with the order of this Court, made on the 21st of February 1870, relative to the Bonds issued by this County for the building of said Rail Road.

Richard H Blythe is by the Court appointed dealer of the Weights & Measures of this County and that the said Weights & Measures be kept at the County Seat.

Ordered that Wm W Briggs Sheriff of this County take into his hand the estate of Wm P. Harris dec^d administered by Susan A Harris the former Executrix and deliver the same according to law.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till the first day of the next Term.
