The Sheriff having returned on these Executions that he had
 by virtue thereof seized in all the Chattel Estate
 of said Duke, consisting of Stock of goods, and
 land, one buggy & harness, one jenny wagon and that the
 said J. W. Duke claimed the Constitutional Exemption
 as appears by the papers returned with the said Exemption
 Whereupon the Plaintiff by their attorney moved the Court to set
 aside the proceedings had by said Duke claiming said
 Exemption on the ground that he is not a household
 as provided for in the law, and that said Law is contrary
 to the Constitution of the United States and is now
 void and that pending the Consideration of said
 questions a Receiver be appointed to take charge of
 said Estate Whereupon on Consideration of the same
 the Court with order that the Sheriff of this County,
 take charge of said Estate and keep the same safe
 till the further order of the Court, disposing of
 by sale such of the said Estate (if any) that may
 be perishable, and he report his proceedings to
 the next Court and the said Motion is continued

John J. Kindred, one of the Commissioners in
 Charge of this Court, is appointed Commissioner
 of Accounts, under an act of assembly passed approved
 July 17th 1870, whereupon the said John J. Kindred
 took and subscribed the Oaths required by law

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till the first day of
 the next Term.
