Powell, Five dollars and Seventy Cents, to Tillman Adams, Twenty three dollars, to A. B. Davis, Thirty Seven dollars, to Dr. J. B. Powell, Forty Seven dollars and ten Cents, to Geo. M. Hughes, administrator, Ninety two dollars and forty five Cents, to Geo. M. Hughes, Thirteen dollars and Eighty Cents, to J. P. Edwards, two dollars and Seventy Cents, and to Myler Myrick, Four dollars and Seventy nine Cents.
