The Defendant says he is not guilty in manner and form as in the Information against him is alleged, and of setting his foot upon the body of the country and the ally for the Commonwealth likewise, and stand upon Oath & Jury to wit, Brum S. Sykes, William Cole, Albert Bryant, James Blair, W. Williams, Wm. A. Schell, B. E. Turner, Henry Ferguson, A. H. Barham, J. W. Britton, M. M. Ferguson, Robert Williams, who being elected tried and sworn the truth to speak upon the issue joined, upon their Oath do say "No the Jury finds the Defendant Kelly not guilty" Therefore it is considered by the Court that the said Defendant be acquitted and discharged of the Offense aforesaid.

On the Motion of James G. Jones, who made Oath as the law directs, and entered into a bond in the penalty of Twenty five dollars, Conditioned according to law, with John S. Branch his Security, (who justified in Oath as to his sufficiency,) and which said bond being acknowledged by the obligors therein is now to be recorded. Certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration in the Estate of Thomas Young dead in due form.

Ordered that A. S. Stevenson, J. C. Griffin and B. W. Herring, being fully duly sworn for the purpose, do appraise all the goods and chattels of Thomas Young dead and return the appraisement under their hands according to law.

On the Motion of James E. Schell, who made Oath as the law directs, and entered into a bond in the penalty of one thousand dollars, Conditioned according to law, with William J. Schell his Security, (who justified in Oath as to his sufficiency,) and which said bond being acknowledged by the obligors therein is ordered to be recorded. Certificate is granted the said James E. Schell for obtaining letters of administration in the Estate of John James dead in due form with his will annexed heretofore recorded in this Court in due form.
