Henry and Samuel Kindred

This day came the attorney for the Commonwealth and the Defendants were brought into Court, in Custody of the Sheriff of this County, and pleaded not guilty to the Indictment to which the attorney for the Commonwealth replied generally, and thereupon counsel for the defense, Messrs. St. John, Ely, Bryant, Leonard, Bull, Thayer, J. Bradshaw, Carr, Scott, Geo. H. Tardner, Jacobus Johnson, & Albert A. Rieford, who being called upon and sworn, the Court then found, upon their Oaths, do say, "We the Jury find Henry Kindred not guilty. We find Samuel Kindred guilty." Therefore it is considered by the Court that the said Samuel Kindred do confine in the Jail of this County for the term of twenty four months, and thereafter till she pays the costs of this prosecution, and as to the Defendant Henry Kindred, it is considered by the Court, that he be acquitted and discharged of the offense aforesaid and be discharged from Custody.

Substantive

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By Consent of parties this cause this day came on to be heard in the Plaintiffs bill the answer of Henry Bradshaw, Morduei Bradshaw, John Harris, and Sarah his wife, and the answer of the four infant Defendants Messrs. H. Morison, Susan S. and David Bradshaw by S. R. Edwards their Guardian ad litem, general replication thereto, and was argued by Counsel; on consideration whereof, the Court doth adjudge, order and decree, that upon Samuel Kellie paying to J. L. Tuley late Sheriff and administrator of Morduei Bradshaw died the sum of Three Hundred Dollars, that the said Tuley shall and may give to the said Kellie a receipt for and discharge in full of the Judgment obtained by Morduei Bradshaw against the said Samuel Kellie on the 17th of August 1861, for Three Hundred dollars with interest from the 1st of December 1858, till paid. And the Court doth further adjudge, order and decree, that Samuel Kellie pay the costs of this Suit.
