

can be allotted to any party, who will accept it, and pay therefor to the other parties such sum of money as their interest therein may entitle them to receive.
 3^d Whether an allotment of part of said real Estate and sales of the residue can be made and whether the interests of those entitled to the Subject, or its proceeds, will be promoted by a sale of the entire Subject.
 That the said Commissioners report their proceedings to Court, with any matters specially stated deemed pertinent by themselves, or which any party may require to be so stated.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till tomorrow morning ten o'clock.

This day this Cause came on to be again heard in the presence personally read out in the Report of James Drury, A. G. Rylands and Benjamin Turner. Those of the Commissioners appointed Under an order of this Court rendered at the present Term, and was argued by Counsel; in consideration whereof the Court adjourned deciding any question in this case arising out of the construction of the will of Samuel Drury, an Exhibit in this case, with adjudge, order and decree, that William S. Goodwyn and John F. Winand, who are appointed Commissioners for the purpose, after giving thirty days previous public notice, of the time, place, and terms of sale, sell to the highest bidder, on the premises, on a credit of one, two, three and four years, equal annual installments, except such sufficient to pay costs of suit and expenses of sale, the real Estate of which Joseph A. Drury, was possessed Under the Will of his father, Samuel Drury, called Druryville, and one half of Water grist mill on "Poplar Swamp"; and the Land therein attached, taking of the purchasers bond with good personal security for the deferred payments, to carry interest from the day of sale, retaining the title to the Land until all of the purchase money is paid, and return the Bonds with their Report to this Court. And the Commissioners are hereby authorized to sell Druryville either as a whole or in separate tracts, as to them shall seem best. But this Court shall be suspended until the said Commissioners, or one of them shall enter into Bond and Security in the Clerk's Office of this County, in
