This day this Cause was decided by leave of the Court and
consent of parties, and the Complainant filed their bill
and in their Motion L. R. Edwards is assigned Guardian
ad litem to defend the Infants John and Samuel Horrell,
who themselves filed their answer to which the Complainant
replied generally, and this Cause coming on to
be heard in the Complainant's Bill the answer of
the Infants Defendants, general replication thereto,
was argued by Counsel, on consideration whereof the Court
doth adjudge, Order and decree, that John Davis, Arrington
Gardner, and Edwin Bradshaw, be and they are hereby
appointed ^{Special} Commissioners for the purpose, that they shall
be assigned, to Mary Horrell, widow of Matthew Horrell,
and their in virtue of the real Estate of which Matthew
Horrell died seized, to be held by the said Mary Horrell
for and during her Natural life, as her dower out of the
Estate of her husband; and the said Commissioners are
directed to report to this Court their proceedings under this
Order; and the Court doth further adjudge Order and decree,
that W. W. Briggs, who is hereby appointed a Commissioner
for the purpose, proceed to allot and assign to the parties
entitled thereto, the respective shares of the Land
whereof Matthew Horrell died seized, but if partition
of the real Estate cannot be made in kind without
loss or injury to the parties, then the Court doth Order,
adjudge and decree, that W. W. Briggs be and he is
hereby appointed a Special Commissioner for the
purpose, that he sell the real Estate in the proceed-
ings mentioned Subject to the Widow's right of dower,
after having advertised the time, place and terms of
Sale, for twenty days, at three or more public places
in the County; that the Sale be made upon the
following terms, to-wit: in Cash to defray expenses of
Suit and Sale, including a fee of Twenty five dollars
to J. B. Prince, Attorney, balance on a Credit of Twelve
