

The faithful discharge of the duties required of him under this Decree, and any other Decree, he may be required to execute in this Cause.

It appearing to the Court from the Report of Wm. W. Briggs Sheriff of Southampton and ex-Lock Keeper, that William G. Arnold is now confined in Jail as a Lunatic, and that from the Condition of the Jail, it would be imprudent and dangerous to confine the said Lunatic there, as he could not safely be intrusted with fire in a wooden building, that being the character of the Jail - Therefore the Court doth adjudge, and Order, that the said William W. Briggs Contract with some fit and proper person, for the maintenance and Care of the said Wm. G. Arnold, provided the said allowance does not exceed forty cents a day, and that the said Wm. W. Briggs will report his proceedings to Court.

On the motion of David St Thomas against James B. Vick, C. C. Williams, James Holmes, Jesse B. Vick & Wm. W. Briggs - This day came the plaintiff by his attorney and it appearing to the Court that the defendants James B. Vick, C. C. Williams & Wm. W. Briggs have had legal notice of this motion. By consent of parties this motion is continued till the next Term of this Court.
