This day this Cause came on again to be heard on the
papers formerly read and the Report of Commissioner Taylor
to which no exceptions have been filed and was argued
by Counsel; in Consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge
order and decree, that the said Report be confirmed, and
it appearing to the Court necessary from the said Commission-
er's Report that the Land of Richard L. Bryant should
be sold in order to pay the Judgment here shown the Court
doth further adjudge order and decree that William W.
Briggs Sheriff of Southampton, who is hereby appointed
for that purpose, shall after having given at least
twenty days Notice of the time and place of sale
by public advertisement at the Court house and in the
Neighborhood, proceed to sell on the premises,
at public auction, to the highest bidder, the two
tracts of Land in Cypress Swamp one containing
42 1/2 acres and the other Sixty Six and two thirds
acres belonging to Richard L. Bryant, on the follow-
ing terms to wit; Sufficiently in Cash to pay the
Costs of this Suit and expenses of the Sale including
a fee of thirty dollars to William B. Shandy the
Plaintiff's Counsel and the balance of the purchase money on
a Credit of one, two, and three years, taking from the
purchaser's bonds with approved Security, the bond in
equal instalments carrying Six per Cent interest from the
day of Sale, and return the Bonds with his Report to this
Court, in order to a further decree. But the said
William W. Briggs shall not sell the said Land
unless they bring at least three fourths of their
value according to the last appraisement and shall
Report that fact to the Court.
