

This Cause was this day docketed by leave of Court and Consent of parties and came on to be heard on the Complainant's bill and Exhibits therewith filed, the answer of the Defendant and replications thereto; and was argued by Counsel; On consideration whereof, the Court doth adjudge, Order and decree, that William B. Saunders, Gailbert S. Barkham, Melly St. Britt, William Worrell, William E. Beaton, and H. Thomas Barkham, be and they are hereby appointed Special Commissioners for that purpose, (any five of whom may act,) that they divide into two just and equal Shares in Value, the real Estate granted and conveyed by Benjamin B. Kindred and Joseph St. Barkham by Deed of Bargain and Sale admitted to record in the Clerk's Office of the County Court of Southampton County on the 1st day of November A.D. 1848, and described therein as follows, to wit, all that Tract of Land in which the said B. B. Kindred now resides, lying near Brykings Depot; supposed to contain Six hundred and fifty acres, more or less, and bounded by the Lands of Melly St. Britt, William Tyler Bryant, Everett Bryant & others, ^{and all other adjacent lands to John St. Leger and the other heirs of James M. Corbett} The said Commissioners are authorized to demand necessary help from the services of a competent Surveyor; and they are ordered to report to this Court in order to a final decree.

Ordered that Hardy Lawrence, be exempt from the payment of taxes and County living in future, he being aged and infirm.

Ordered that the account of Dr. W. A. Parker, Physician appointed to attend the Prisoners confined in the jail of this County, amounting to Fifty dollars, be Certified to the Auditor of Public accounts for his Examination and payment.

Ordered that W. W. Briggs Sheriff of this County, take into his hands the Estate of James Payne decd and administer the same according to law.

Joseph B. Prince who was elected Attorney for the Communicants in this County by the qualified Voters thereof at the election held on the Eighth day of November 1870 for the term of three years commencing on the first day of January 1871, this day appeared in Court and qualified by taking and subscribing the Oaths required by law.
