

This day Came the Attorney for the Commonwealth and the prisoner was
 set to the bar in custody of the Jailor of this Court, and the prisoner was
 in discharge of his obligations and being arraigned pleaded not
 guilty to the indictment, and a panel of twenty four persons
 summoned by the Sheriff, were examined by the Court, found free from all
 legal exceptions and qualified to serve as Jurors according to law.
 Thereupon the accused was sworn by the panel eight of said Jurors, and
 from the remaining sixteen the following twelve Jurors were selected
 by lot, to whom there was no objection, to wit: S. B. Murdock,
 Henry E. Jagers, Charles M. Jagers, John Standley, R. J. Blum, Geo.
 B. Scott, Eliza Bryant, A. Atkinson, L. L. Murray, W. W. Stephenson,
 John J. Turner and Walter White who were sworn the twelve of
 said Jurors promising to speak, and after hearing the evidence and argu-
 ments of Counsel retired to their room to consult on a verdict and
 after some time returned into Court with the following verdict, to wit:
 "We the Jury find the prisoner Guilty, and Sentence him to Confinement
 in the Penitentiary one year." The prisoner by his Counsel moved the
 Court to set aside the said verdict and grant him a new trial,
 and the Court took time to consider and being fully advised, it is
 ordered that the verdict of the Jury be set aside and a new trial
 granted, and on the motion of the said Archer Jagers and for reasons
 appearing to the Court, it is ordered that the said verdict be set
 aside and that a new trial be had upon the indictment aforesaid.
 And thereupon the said Archer Jagers with Alfred J. Stephenson, Murdock
 M. Clayton, Charles W. Stephenson and Mills E. Stephenson his securities
 acknowledged themselves indebted to the Commonwealth of Virginia
 as follows: The said Archer Jagers in the sum of three hundred
 dollars, and the said Securities in the sum of three hundred
 dollars, to be levied of their respective goods and chattels, land
 and tenements, for the use of the said Commonwealth; but to
 be void if the said Archer Jagers shall personally appear in
 this Court on the first day of April next and surrender
 himself into custody and not depart thence without leave of
 this Court.

Louis Berdy who stands charged with a felony was set to the bar in custody of the jailor of this Court and
 the grand jury having returned the bill of indictment "Not a true bill" proclamation was made as the
 manner is and nothing being alleged against him it is therefore ordered that the said Louis Berdy
 be discharged from custody.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till tomorrow morning
 ten o'clock.
