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On Motion of J. L. Toler Sheriff and as such administrator of Margaret Worrell dec'd. The Court doth order that the said Toler be authorized to expend \$25. for the Support of Judith E. Worrell for the year 1871, and the sum of \$25. for the Support of G. F. Worrell for the year 1871, Infant children of Margaret Worrell dec'd.

On the Motion of John Emmitt. It is ordered that Wm. H. Briggs Sheriff of this County, take into his hands the Estate of James Barney dec'd and administer the same according to law.

Archer Japer who stands Indicted of Bigamy, and to whom a writ of Habeas Corpus was awarded at the last term of this Court, appeared in Court and discharge of his recognizances, entered into at the last term, and was again set to the bar in custody of the Sheriff of this County, and a panel of twenty four persons, summoned by the Sheriff of this County, were examined by the Court, found free from all legal exceptions and qualified to serve as Jurors according to law. Thereupon the accused was called from the panel eight of said Jurors, and from the remaining twelve the following twelve Jurors were selected by lot, to whom there was no objection, to wit: Wm. J. Hoek, James S. Gardner, Joseph Gray, Jas. E. Lawrence, Geo. Williams, W. J. Sebell, Robert J. Williams, B. St. James, Jas. R. Kello, Joseph G. Campbell, B. F. Lord and Horst Branchy, who were sworn the truth of and upon the premises to speak, and after hearing the evidence and arguments of Counsel, retired to their room to consult on a verdict, and after some time returned into Court with the following verdict, to wit: "We the Jury find the Prisoner Guilty, and give him term of Imprisonment in the Penitentiary at three years", and thereupon the said Archer Japer is remanded to jail.
