 there was no objection, to wit, Elisha J. Jones, Octavius Wells, John B. Ross,
 J. S. Webb, Giles Raiford, Yachariah Dugal, S. Lewis, John S. Wells, Jas
 E. Edwards, Willis Bradshaw, F. E. Williams and Williams Lewis, who
 were sworn the Court of and upon the premises to speak, and after hearing
 the evidence and argument of Counsel retired to their rooms to consult
 on their verdict and after some time returned into Court saying they could
 not agree on a verdict and therefore they were given in charge to the
 Sheriff of this County, to whom was administered an Oath that he
 would keep them together without communication with any person,
 that he would not converse with them himself touching this trial,
 nor permit any other person to do so, and would cause them to appear
 in Court tomorrow morning at nine O'clock and the Prisoner is
 remanded to Jail.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned until tomorrow
 morning nine O'clock.
