James E. Westbrook, who was elected Assessor in the Township of Ironsboro in this County, by the qualified Voters thereof, at the Election held on the 25th day of May, 1871, for the Term of one year, Commencing on the 1st day of July 1871, and after said Term of Office shall have expired until his Successor is qualified to enter upon the discharge of the duties of said Office, this day with William Trines, his Security, (who justified in Court as to his Sufficiency,) and who was approved by the Court, entered into and acknowledged a Bond in the penalty of Two Thousand Dollars, (conditioned according to Law) which Bond is ordered to be recorded. The said James E. Westbrook, also took and Subscribed the Oaths required by Law.
