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Sullivan A. Gay, who was elected Sheriff in the Township of Franklin in this County, by the qualified Voters thereof, at the Election held on the 25th day of May 1871, for the term of two years commencing on the 1st day of July 1871, and after said term of Office shall have expired, until his Successor is qualified to enter upon the discharge of the duties of said Office, this day with Josiah S. Gay and James B. Gay his Securities, (who justified on Oath as to their sufficiency,) and who was approved by the Court, entered into and acknowledged a Bond in the penalty of Five Thousand Dollars, Conditioned according to Law, which Bond is ordered to be recorded. The said Sullivan A. Gay also took and Subscribed the Oaths required by Law.

Emmett W. Kollay, who was elected Township Clerk in the Township of Bingham in this County, by the qualified Voters thereof, at the Election held on the 25th day of May 1871, for the term of two years commencing on the 1st day of July 1871, and after said term of Office shall have expired, until his Successor is qualified to enter upon the discharge of the duties of said Office, this day with W. M. Beaton his Security, (who justified on Oath as to his sufficiency,) and who was approved by the Court, entered into and acknowledged a Bond in the penalty of One Thousand Dollars, Conditioned according to Law, which Bond is ordered to be recorded. The said Emmett W. Kollay also took and Subscribed the Oaths required by Law.

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M. M. Weymouth, who was elected a Justice of the Peace in the Township of Jerusalem, in this County, by the qualified Voters thereof, at the Election held on the 25th day of May 1871, for the term of three years commencing on the 1st day of July 1871, and after said term of Office shall have expired, until his Successor is qualified to enter upon the discharge of the duties of said Office, this day qualified by taking and Subscribing the Oaths required by Law.

J. H. Still, who was elected a Justice of the Peace in the Township of Bingham in this County, by the qualified Voters thereof at the Election held on the 25th day of May 1871, for the term of three years commencing on the 1st day of July 1871, and after said term of Office shall have expired, until his Successor is qualified to enter upon the discharge of the duties of said Office, this day qualified by taking and Subscribing the Oaths required by Law.
