

Henderson Camp was this day back to the bar in custody of the Sheriff

 Bury, Knight, Robt. M. Williams, Geo. Williams, Geo. Bryant,  
 S. L. Murray, Robt. Whitehead, Wm. J. Smith, Jas. M. Bury,  
 Henry Ferguson, David W. Nicholas, and J. E. Applewhite,  
 who were sworn the truth of and upon the promising to speak,  
 and after hearing heard the evidence and arguments of Counsel,  
 retired to their room, to consult on a verdict and after some time  
 returned into Court having found the following Verdict, to wit, "We  
 the Jury find the Prisoner Guilty, and upon his Term of Imprisonment  
 in the Penitentiary for two years" and the Prisoner is remanded  
 to Jail.

The last Will and Testament of Harry S. Johnson decd. was  
 proved by the Oaths of Alfred T. Stephenson and M. M.  
 Clayton the Subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to  
 be recorded.
