It appears to the Court from satisfactory evidence introduced that Owen Myrick to whom ^{copy} Land Warrant N^o 23337, was issued for Eighty acres of Land dated 27 February 1856 signed by J. Minor Commissioner died on or about the 24th day of December 1859 leaving a Will in which Martha A. Cummins the Wife of Thomas Cummins is his sole devisee. Which is ordered to be certified.

Ordered that W. H. Briggs, Sheriff of this County out of any contingent money in his hands not otherwise appropriated, pay to Richard M. James fifty dollars for removing said pine (or) bridge.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till tomorrow morning ten o'clock.
