

Ordered that Sylvanus Mins, A W Williams, Calvin H. Scarborough be appointed viewers to view the present location of the road leading from the Jerusalem road and Cabin Point road near J. E. Cokers to the Appamossic bridge and any other road that may be proposed and report as to the propriety of changing the location of the said road and as to the conveniences and inconveniences that will result as well to individuals as to the public by such change -

The Commissioners appointed to let the repairs of Branches Bridges this day made their report which the ^{Court} approves and confirms -

The Commissioners heretofore appointed to act with the Commissioners in behalf of the County of Isle of Wight in viewing Broad Water Bridge this day made their report. On consideration whereof the Court doth appoint W. G. Holmes & John C. Griffin on the part of this County with the Commissioners of Isle of Wight County to let to the lowest undertaker the repairs necessary to the said Bridge take bond with good security from the undertaker for the faithful performance of the contract and report the same to this Court for its ratification or rejection -

The Commissioners heretofore appointed to view Bowers road leading from near James Adams gate to Franklin this day made their report. On consideration whereof it is ordered that the Surveyor of the Second district in the Township of Franklin shall proceed to expend by Contract the sum of One hundred dollars in repairing said road above described and make his report -

Ordered that James M. Corbett, Treasurer of Southampton County, out of the Contingent County levy in his hands, for the year 1891, not otherwise appropriated, pay to Benj. E. Morrell, the sum of Eight hundred dollars the amount agreed to be paid said Morrell for the rebuilding of the bridges and the repairs of the Embankment on the West Side of the Appamossic River at the Cypress bridge. But this amount is not to be paid before said work is received by the Commissioners and their report confirmed by the Court -

George Davis who stands committed to jail charged with breaking and entering a dwelling house in the night with intent to commit a rape, was set to the bar in custody of the jailor of this Court and the grand jury having ^{returned} the indictment against him "not a true bill" it is ordered that he be acquitted and discharged of the said offence but that he be remanded to jail in order to be tried upon another indictment for felony -

George Davis who stands indicted for breaking & entering a dwelling house in the night time with intent to commit murder, was set to the Bar in custody of the jailor of this Court and being thereof arraigned pleaded not guilty to the indictment. And a panel of twenty four persons summoned by the Sheriff were examined by the Court, found free from all legal exceptions and qualified to serve as jurors according to law. Thereupon the accused waived from the panel eight of said jurors, and from the remaining sixteen, the following twelve jurors were selected by lot, to whom there was no
