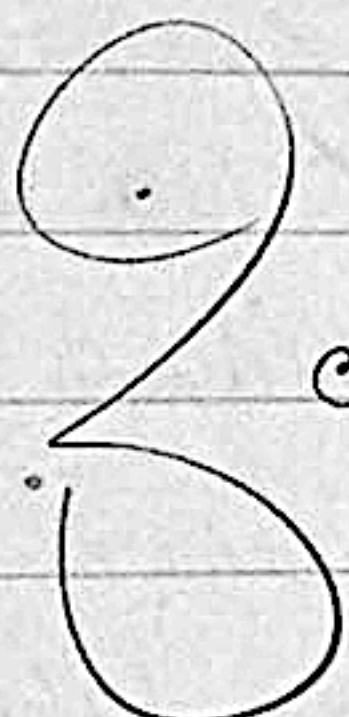
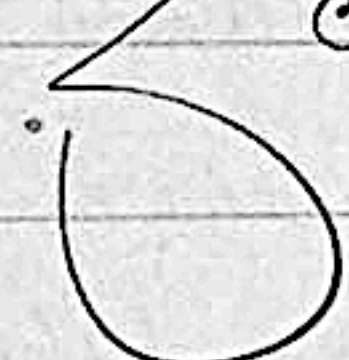


Thursday. August 24th 1871.

Henderson Camp who stands convicted of entering a dwelling house in the night without breaking with intent to commit larceny was again set to the bar in custody of the jailer of this Court and it being demanded of him if any thing for himself he had or knew to say why the Court should not now proceed to pronounce judgment against him according to law and nothing being offered or alleged in delay of judgment it is considered by the Court that the said Henderson Camp be imprisoned in the Penitentiary of this Commonwealth for the term of two years ^{in their jurisdiction ascertained} the period by the jurors. And the Sheriff of this County is ordered as soon as possible after the adjournment of this Court to remove and carry the said Henderson Camp from the jail of this Court to the Penitentiary of this Commonwealth, therein to be kept imprisoned and treated in the manner directed by law for the term aforesaid. And the prisoner is remanded to jail.

Congdon, the said Wood is accordingly substituted as next friend
