

Monday 1st day of January 1872 -
Present.

The Hon. Joseph W. Urehart, Judge.

Ordered that the account of Joseph B. Prince attorney for the Commonwealth in this Court amounting to ten dollars and the account of W. W. Briggs Sheriff of this County amounting to thirteen ⁵⁰/₁₀₀ Dollars be severally certified to the Auditor of Public accounts for his examination and payment.

On the application of Scutchins & Webb who wish to obtain a license to retail ardent spirits &c at their store at the Atterbury Mills in this County. It appears to the Court that the applicants are persons of sobriety and good character and the place proposed suitable and convenient.

Sylvanus Stines, A. W. Williams & Calvin M. Scarborough the Commissioners appointed at August Term last to view the road leading from the Jerusalem & Cabin Point road near J. S. Cokers to the Apamoose Bridge and any other route that may be proposed. This day made a report which is in these words "To the Hon. Court of Southampton. We Commissioners appointed at your last August Term to view the present road leading from the Jerusalem and Cabin Point road near Jno. S. Cokers to the Apamoose Bridge and report the conveniences &c and also the propriety of changing said road, beg respectfully to report as follows. The present road is, as we think, very indurous and inconvenient to Jno. S. Coker it runs immediately through his household tract, which contains only twenty eight acres causing him to have four fences to keep up. We recommend to your Worship to change the present route to run as follows, from the Cabin Point to commence at Majr. J. W. Urehart's farm on the North and run at such points as he may suggest, to the Apamoose Bridge. We think the proposed route will convenience the public and also private individuals. Dec. 18 1871 - Sylvanus Stines, A. W. Williams & C. M. Scarborough - Commissioners."

On consideration whereof and of all the circumstances of the case it is the opinion of the Court that the said road should be altered as proposed and it is ordered that the same Commissioners Sylvanus Stines, A. W. Williams & C. M. Scarborough do let to the lowest bidder the opening of a new road, beginning on the Cabin Point Road at the upper or north end of J. W. Urehart's orchard, & running nearly a straight course (varying according to convenience) to the Apamoose bridge, that they receive the said road when opened according to Contract, and make report to the Court.

The Commissioners appointed to let the building of a bridge over Atterbury Swamp at Pethlow's mill this day made a report which is in these words to wit: "To the Court of Southampton County. We, the Commissioners appointed to have a bridge built over Atterbury Swamp at Pethlow's mill beg leave to submit the following report. The bridge after being duly advertised, was let to J. D. Pethlow (he being the lowest bidder) for seventy four dollars. The work has been completed according to Contract and the bridge has been received by us. Nov 11th 1871." On consideration whereof & of all the circumstances of the case the Court doth ratify the said report.
