Thomas Lufsey who is charged on oath by Mary A Bullis an unmarried white woman of this County with being the father of a male bastard child of which she was delivered on the 12th day of May 1870 this day appeared in Court according to the condition of his recognizance And thereupon the said Mary A Bullis being sworn and examined and the said Thomas Lufsey fully heard the Court upon the circumstances of the case doth adjudge the said Thomas Lufsey to be the father of the said bastard child and that the said child is likely to become chargeable to this County Therefore it is considered by the Court that the said Thomas Lufsey pay to the Overseers of the Poor of this County for the maintenance of the said child the sum of forty dollars a year for the term of five years from this day unless it sooner die. And it is ordered that the said Thomas Lufsey enter into bond with good and sufficient security in the penalty of two hundred dollars for the performance of the above order of the Court and that he be committed to jail until such bond be given in Court or filed in the Clerk's Office, or the said Mary A Bullis & the Overseers of the Poor consent to his discharge, or he be otherwise legally discharged And it is ordered that the said Thomas Lufsey pay the costs of this prosecution.

On the motion of George W Stephenson It is ordered that Joseph F. Glade, A. W. Williams & W. W. Stephenson do lay off and assign by proper notes and bonds, to Caroline Kello her dower - one third in value - in the lands of her late husband Merot M Kello dec'd in this County - and make report to Court.

The Commissioners heretofore appointed to let to the lowest undertaker the rebuilding of a bridge across Westbrook's Mill swamp in this County this day made their report which is in these words: "In obedience to the above order we the undersigned Commissioners, advertised and let to the lowest undertaker the rebuilding of the Bridge across Westbrook's Mill Swamp. It was undertaken by George Story for the sum of \$44.60. The bridge has been completed & received, agreeable to Contract Given under our hands this 30th day of Dec. 1871. Rob. Rowland Jas. E. P. Wors. Comps." Whereupon the Court doth approve & ratify the said report.

On the motion of L. R. Edwards It is ordered that James E. Everett admr of James Barnes who was Exor. of Jesse Ferguson pay to L. R. Edwards the sum of \$44.33 for board of Jesse T. Edwards for 1871.

R. J. Darden, Jas. H. Devany & E. J. Gardner three of the Commissioners appointed to ascertain what will be a just compensation for the land proposed to be taken by the Trustees of Jerusalem School district. of the lands of the estate of Jonathan Darden dec'd near Jerusalem, this day made a report and no good cause being shown against the report the same is confirmed and ordered to be recorded and is in these words: "We Jas.
