Mills A. Britt who has been appointed a Notary Public for this County by a Commission from the Governor under the Seal of the Commonwealth dated the 28th day of February 1872. and to hold the said Office and to perform the duties thereof as prescribed by law this day with Edgar B. Beaton his Security who justified on oath as to his sufficiency, entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of two hundred and fifty dollars conditioned according to law which bond is ordered to be recorded. The said Mills A. Britt also took and subscribed the oaths prescribed by law.

Jack Kindred who stands committed to the Jail of this County was brought into Court and being fully heard and the evidence adduced considered it is the opinion of the Court and accordingly ordered that the said Jack Kindred enter into a recognizance with good security to keep the peace and be of good behaviour towards the Commonwealth and all its citizens for the term of one year from this day. Whereupon the said Jack Kindred with Tom Hunt his Security here in Court severally acknowledge themselves indebted to the Commonwealth of Virginia that is to say the said Jack Kindred in the sum of fifty dollars and the said Tom Hunt in the like sum of fifty dollars to be levied of their goods and chattels lands and tenements for the use of the Commonwealth. Yet upon the Condition that if the said Jack Kindred shall keep the peace and be of good behaviour towards the Commonwealth and all its citizens for the term of twelve months from this day then the above recognizance to be void or else to remain in full force and virtue.

The last Will and Testament of Julian Thomas Clayton dec^d was proved by the oaths of Jas E. Stephenson & A. T. Stephenson the subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded.

Ordered that J. M. Corbett County Treasurer out of the County levy pay Luther R. Edwards five dollars for copying the Registration Books at Franklin for the use of this Court.

Ordered that J. M. Corbett County Treasurer out of the County levy pay James E. Gillette five dollars for copying the Registration Books at Inor for the use of this Court.

On the motion of James Drury & William Fries for reasons appearing to the Court that James Drury & William Fries be removed from the County Jail in future on account of age & infirmity.
