

On the motion of Wm St. Preston for opening a road from Ivor Depot on the Norfolk & Petersburg Rail Road, and to terminate at the Proctors Bridge Road at a point as near as practicable to Proctors Bridge. It is ordered that P. J. Holmes, C. F. Preston & Mr. G. Holmes unless Jn: T. Wells the undertaker under the order of March Term 1871 complies with his contract do select to the lowest undertaker the opening of the said road, that they receive it when opened & put in good repair and make report to Court.

This Court having been notified by the County Court of Isle of Wight County that a bridge is necessary over the Black Water River at the point where the Bridge formerly known as "Joyners Bridge" crossed said River between the Counties of Isle of Wight and Southampton and this Court concurring in that opinion doth appoint James Holmes Bartley Boners and Henry W. Cobb

Commissioners do meet at the site of the of the former Bridge ^{on the 1st day of May 1872} and agree with Commissioners of Isle of Wight County as to the manner and Conditions of doing the work and report the result of their conference to this Court. And it is ordered that a copy of this order be forwarded to the Court of Isle of Wight County.

The Commissioners appointed by this Court to act with Commissioners appointed by the County Court of Isle of Wight County to let the rebuilding of Proctors Bridge across Black Water River this day made report in the following words "We undersigned Commissioners appointed respectively by the County Courts of our Counties of Isle of Wight and Southampton beg leave most respectfully to report to your Honors the Judges of the Courts that having let Proctors Bridge across Black Water River according to order under certain Specifications, that the said Bridge has been completed in Workmanlike manner and according to the terms of letting by Mr. A. J. Mollum the undertaker at a Cost to the two Counties of Eight hundred and eighty nine & 50/100 Dollars and that we most respectfully ask your Honors to sanction this acceptance of us of said Bridge. To the Judges of the Counties of Isle of Wight & Southampton. On consideration whereof the Court ratifies and confirms said Report.

On the motion of Wm St. Jenkins to establish a road beginning at or near ^{the corner of} James H. Jenkins fence on the road leading from Jerusalem to Black Water Bridge and proceeding of thence along a private way by Jenkins' Mill over his mill dam to the road at or near the Union meeting house. Joshua Preston, J. A. Kitchen Wm St. Jenkins & John Preston Sr. are appointed viewers, any three of whom may act, to view the ground and report to the Court the conveniences & inconveniences that will result as well to individuals as to the public if such road shall be as proposed and especially whether any yard, garden or orchard, or any part thereof, will in such case have to be taken.

On the motion of Benj. E. Morrell against R. M. Kinder Barnes for a new bond & security as Constable. This day came the said Morrell by his attorney and the said Barnes not appearing but failing to comply with the order made against him in this case at the last term of this Court. It is ordered that he be removed from the Office of Constable aforesaid and that he pay to the said Morrell his costs in this behalf expended.
