

Wm M Beaton who feels himself aggrieved by the assessment of his lands made under the provisions of the Act of Assembly entitled "An act providing for the reassessment of the lands throughout the Commonwealth" approved July 9, 1871 and acts amendatory thereto this day applied to the Court to have the assessment of his tract of land charged on the assessors land book for the Township of Boykin in this County for the year 1871, described as containing 4.54 acres - Boykins Depot - 1/4 miles from the Court house assessed at \$33. per acre - improvements \$12,000. Corrected. And it appearing to the Court that notice in writing of this application has been given to Jos L Barham the assessor who assessed the said land to which notice was appended an affidavit of the applicant that in his opinion the assessment of his land is above the true value thereof. The Court after hearing the applicant and the attorney for the Commonwealth in this Court who was present defending the interest of the Commonwealth and all the evidence adduced is satisfied that the assessment of the said land and the improvements thereon is too high that (\$10,000) Ten thousand dollars - that is to say \$8,000 for the buildings & two thousand dollars for the land - is the true value of said tract of land including building. It is therefore ordered that the assessment be corrected accordingly.

The Court assign Person J Thomas Guardian to Virginia H Jey orphan of John H Jey dec. and thereupon the said Person J Thomas with Joseph H Prince his security who justified on oath as to his sufficiency, entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Twenty five hundred dollars conditioned according to law which bond is ordered to be recorded the required revenue stamp of one dollar being affixed thereto and duly cancelled.

Tempy Banks who stands bound by recognizance for her appearance here this day to answer the Commonwealth of a certain felony of which she is accused appeared in discharge of her said recognizance and thereupon she the said Tempy Banks with Emory Buck Joe Banks & Penrose Jackson her securities here in Court severally acknowledge themselves indebted to the Commonwealth of Virginia the said Tempy Banks in the sum of twenty five dollars and the said Emory Buck Joe Banks & Penrose Jackson in the like sum of twenty five dollars of their respective goods & chattels lands & tenements to be levied and to the use of the Commonwealth rendered: but to be void if the said Tempy Banks shall personally appear in this Court on the first day of the next term, surrender herself in custody and not depart thence without leave of the Court.
