 committing an assault and battery upon the body of John Copeland at Smiths ferry in
 the County of Southampton on or about the 3rd day of May 1872 upon the witness

 grand jury to give evidence - And the said grand jury having nothing to present were
 discharged"

Ordered that the following accounts be paid: One in favor of Charles Beale amounting to
 \$14⁵⁰/₁₀₀ dollars one in favor of Aug. Crumpler amounting to \$3⁴⁰/₁₀₀ & one in favor of
 John Brown amounting to \$4⁴⁰/₁₀₀ dollars be severally certified to the auditor of public
 accounts for his examination & payment.

Robert Blor is appointed Registrar at Jerusalem in the Township of Jerusalem in the place
 of John A. Sebell whose resignation is accepted.

Ordered that E. R. Fries, Wm. Beale & J. J. Dyer or a majority of them do let to the
 Court undertaker the keeping of the Mound Ferry for twelve months from the 3rd day of
 May 1872, and make report to the Court.

Keeverson Council Constable in the Township of Franklin in this County this day
 tendered his resignation of said Office which is accepted.

Ordered that J. M. Corbett County treasurer out of the County levy pay A. J. Holliman
 five hundred and thirty three dollars fifty two cents for County's proportion for rebuilding
 Proctors bridge across Black Water River.
