The Commissioners appointed at March Term last of this Court to let to the lowest undertaker the building of a bridge across Wills Creek this day made a report in these words "To the Hon. Judge J. W. Urquhart of the County Court of Southampton Co. We the Commissioners appointed by the March Term of the County Court to the lowest undertaker the building of a bridge across Wills Creek beg leave to make the following report - The building of a bridge 6 1/2 feet high 12 ft wide with railing and with mud sills 10 x 10 inches, posts 10 x 10 in. 4 stringers 4 x 9 with floor 3 1/2 thick all timber to be of heart pine or cypress clear of knots and shakes, the embankment to be level with the Bridge 12 feet wide at top. The abutment was let to D. J. Webb for \$250. We the Commissioners also beg to state that we have made a survey of a new route which we are satisfied will make a better road with less
