

Samuel L. Story is appointed Constable in the Township of Newsons to fill the vacancy caused by the failure of R. J. Fries and to qualify and to hold his office until his successor is elected and qualified. And thereupon the said Samuel L. Story took and subscribed the oath required by law -

Elizabeth J. Joyner with the consent of the Court makes choice of her mother Elizabeth Joyner for her guardian and thereupon the said Elizabeth Joyner with Bartholomew Bowers her security, who justified on oath as to his sufficiency, entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of fifty dollars conditioned according to law. Which bond is ordered to be recorded.

John Kindred the Commissioner of accounts in this Court being disqualified from acting as such by reason of interest in the settlement of his transactions as trustee in a deed of Trustee executed by Peleg Baroon for the benefit of his creditors recorded in the Clerk's office on the 5 day of February 1861. It is ordered that John A. Sebrell one of the Commissioners in Chancery in this Court do act in the place of the said Kindred in the settlement of said account.

Ordered that the account of Mrs Josephine F. Howard Jailor of this Court amounting to Eighty nine ⁶⁰/₁₀₀ dollars be certified to the Auditor of Public Accounts for his examination and Payment.

On the motion of Thomas B. Powell to establish a road leading by said Thos. B. Powell's & P. J. Thomas into the public road near Haley's Bridge. The persons appointed to view the way along which said road is proposed to be run this day made the following report to wit: "The undersigned, who were appointed viewers by an order of the County Court of Southampton entered at the May Term 1871 to view the road leading by Thos. B. Powell & P. J. Thomas to the public road near Haley's bridge & respectfully report to wit: that they have examined said path and that no inconvenience will result to the public, or any individual, that every one living on said path is willing and anxious to have it made a public road, and that no yard, garden or any part thereof nor any orchard will have to be taken. They therefore respectfully ask that this path may be declared a public road, and hands assigned to it. Respectfully Submitted. Thos. B. Powell, P. J. Thomas, David Turner - Viewers. To the Judge of the County Ct. of Southampton - July 1. 1872." On consideration whereof it is the opinion of the Court that the said road or path be established a public highway.

James Bradshaw having been dead more than three months and no person having administration on his estate: On the motion of Ely Bradshaw it is ordered that Wm. Briggs Sheriff of this County take the estate of the said James Bradshaw into his hands and administer the same according to law.
