

Ordered that James T. Everett pay to Anderson Artis twelve dollars out of the interest on \$100. to which Sally and Junius Artis are entitled, for their maintenance & support.

Ordered that James T. Everett expend seventy one ⁵⁹/₁₀₀ dollars of the principal of Jesse T. Edwards' estate in his hands under the will of Jesse Ferguson dec^d for his support.

The last Will and Testament of William T. Bryant dec^d was proved according to law by the oaths of Edward Beaton & Clifton Simmons two of the subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded.

George T. Noworthy an agent to sell a religious book called "The Religious Standard" desiring to sell and distribute the same in this County this day made application for the purpose to this Court. And the Court being satisfied that the applicant is a person of good character and a proper person in whom to confide the trust of selling or distributing said book, doth direct the assessor to grant him a license with a nominal tax only.

On the motion of John Boners who made oath according to law and together with Bart. Boners his security, who justified on oath as to his sufficiency, entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of five hundred dollars conditioned according to law which bond is ordered to be recorded. Certificate is granted the said John Boners for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Susan Boners dec^d in due form.

The Court doth assign Jethro Cobb guardian to Clifford A. Cobb orphan of A. W. Cobb dec^d and thereupon the said Jethro Cobb with Henry V. Cobb his security, who justified on oath as to his sufficiency, entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of eighteen hundred dollars conditioned according to law, which bond is ordered to be recorded.

The Commissioners appointed by this Court to act with the Commissioners appointed by the Court of Isle of Wight County in regard to the rebuilding of Jagers Bridge across the Black Water river, this day returned a bond taken from Isaac A. Kitchen the undertaker with security, which bond & security is approved of & ratified by the Court.

On the motion of Mills Darden and for reasons appearing to the Court he is exempted from the payment of taxes & levies on account of age & infirmity.

The Court certifies that evidence satisfactory has been introduced to prove that John H. Horrell is a citizen of this State, that he lost his left arm in the late War, and was a citizen of the State at the time the loss of said arm, and that he has not received an artificial arm from any other State, the United States or under the provisions of an act entitled "An act to provide artificial limbs to the citizens of the Commonwealth who lost their limbs in the late War" passed January 29th 1867.
