

The Commissioners appointed at June Term last to let to the lowest undertaker the repairs to the bridge across Seacoek Swamp near Ivor Station this day made their report which is approved and Confirmed by the Court and is in the following words to wit: "To Hon. Judge of the County Court of Southampton - Your Commissioners appointed at your June Term 1872 to let the repairs to the bridge across Seacoek Swamp near Ivor Station and receive the same when completed, beg leave to report that in obedience to said order we put up to the lowest undertaker at the bridge on 6th day of July 1872 & reconsidered the bid & let to the lowest undertaker at the bridge on 27th July 1872 such repairs as we considered after carefully examining the bridge to be necessary and John T Wells became contractor for the sum of fifty seven $50/100$ Dollars (\$57.50 100) that being the lowest bid made. The repairs having been made and the work done in good order & finished satisfactory to Commissioners We would recommend that the bridge be received and Mr Wells paid the sum of (\$57.50 100) fifty seven $50/100$ dollars the amount for which it was let. The Commissioners appointed to let the opening of a new road from Ivor to Proctors Bridge this day made their report which is approved and Confirmed by the Court and is in the following words to wit: "To the Hon. Judge, County Court of Southampton - We the Commissioners appointed at your Term 1872 to have opened a new road from Ivor to Proctors bridge receive the same when completed, beg leave to report that the former Contractor Geo. T Wells claiming the contract under the letting at Ivor by Coms. G. W. Stephenson and having completed the road & bridges according to survey and Specifications furnished us by the Clerk of the County Court under which the contract was made. We have carefully examined the road & bridges and find them done in workmanlike manner & according to the contract & Specifications furnished & would respectfully recommend that he Geo. The Commissioners appointed at the last term of this Court to act with Commissioners on the part of Isle of Wight County To let to the lowest undertaker the repairs of Purcells Bridge & Embankment across Black Water River this day made a Report in the following words to wit, "To the Honorable Judge of the County Court of Southampton We the undersigned duly appointed by your Honor. Commissioners for the purpose of viewing Purcells Bridge & Embankment and in conjunction with Commissioners on the part of the County of Isle of Wight (appointed for the same purpose) to let to the lowest undertaker the repairs to said bridge and embankment, be leave respectfully to report. That in pursuance of your order enclosed herewith we met on Friday the 13th Inst. and in conjunction with said Commissioners on the part of Isle of Wight County and after drawing up proper Specifications requiring the putting in of about six thousand feet of heart timber into different parts of the bridge (or rather two, 2, bridges & the placing on the embankment of about 1500) fifteen hundred cubic feet yards of dirt. Mr. Hartwell Powell of the County of Isle of Wight (who proposes to give proper Security) was found to be the lowest bidder and in the sum of
