

To the Honorable Court of Southampton County - We the Commissioners appointed at your September Term 1872 to let the repairs of Round hill Bridge receive the sum when done according to contract, respectfully report, that after giving notice of letting by advertisement, we proceeded to let the same on the premises and William Johnson became the undertaker at \$34.75. Said work has been done according to contract, and received by us Commissioners. R. M. Stephenson. J. Vick. J. E. L. On consideration whereof the said report is approved and ratified by the Court.

Ordered that James M. Corbitt County treasurer, out of the County levy, pay to John D. Blythe thirty five dollars, to Richard A. Blythe thirty five dollars, to George W. Yates thirty five dollars, to George W. Yates Eighteen dollars, to R. A. Blythe \$50.00 dollars, To R. B. Prince abrigue of Robt. Blom twenty three dollars for giving the jail of this County during the confinement therein of Moore Hays charged with felony -

Ordered that James M. Corbitt County treasurer pay to Wm. W. Briggs Sheriff of this County, out of the County levy fourteen dollars expenses attending the removal of Hays charged with felony, from the jail of the City of Norfolk to the Jail of this County.

The last Will and Testament of Goodman Horn deceased was proved by the oaths of Thomas E. Brett & Jesse E. Brett the subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded and on the motion of Martha Horn the executrix therein named who made oath according to law and entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of One thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs but without security, the Will directing that no security should be required and the Court requiring none - which bond is ordered to be recorded - Certificate is granted the said Martha Horn for obtaining a probate of the said will in due form.

Ordered that John Bowers, Samuel A. Holmes, Thomas Brett & John C. Gilfillan or any three of them being first duly sworn for the purpose to appraise all the goods and chattels of Goodman Horn dec'd. that may be produced to them, and return the appraisement under their hands according to law.

James E. Gillette foreman, Wm. A. Bradshaw, Joseph I. Darden, George W. Stephenson & Mills E. Stephenson were sworn a special grand jury of inquest for the body of this County and having received their charge withdrew and after adjournment returned into Court and presented.

And the said grand jury having nothing to present were discharged.

Joel Vick who stands bound by recognizance for his personal appearance before the Court to answer a bill of Indictment to be preferred against him for a misdemeanor committed on or about the 1st day of January last, is not a true bill.
